





1. Health Infrastructure Development Agency Bill.

The Bill seeks to provide for a comprehensive framework to guide the planning, financing, construction, maintenance and regulation of health infrastructure in Nigeria. It also seems to promote the development and improvement of health infrastructure to enhance healthcare access, quality and delivery across the country. The Bill is also targeted at strengthening the healthcare system by focusing on, construction, renovation and modernization of healthcare facilities, ensuring equitable distribution and fostering of public-private partnerships for sustainable infrastructure development.

2. Private Investigators Bill.

The Bill seeks to provide a framework for the licensing and practice of private Investigators in the country. It also provides for a system of regulation, control and conduct of the practice so as to ensure professional standards.

3. Maritime Operations Coordination Board (Amendment) Bill

This Bill seeks to amend the Maritime Coordinating Operations Board Act by expanding the membership of the Board to include other key stakeholders within the Maritime environment, streamline the funding capacity to member agencies and delete wordings reminiscent of military Decrees

4. National Entrepreneur Development Institute Bill

This Bill seeks among other things to create an enabling framework for the establishment, operations and administration of the National Entrepreneurial Development Institute so as to ensure the development of small businesses, support, nurture and assist their growth through the early stages, and for other related matters

5. Public Procurement Act (Amendment) Bill

This Bill seeks to amend the Public Procurement Act, 2007 by providing a specific time line for the conclusion and formalization of the procurement process and procedures.



Report by Distinguished Senator Osita Ngwu, Senate Minority Whip on his Four Months Stewardship as Chairman, Senate Committee on Solid Minerals Development of the 10th Senate of the Federal Republic of Nigeria (Monday, 7th August, 2023 –

REPORT BY DISTINGUISHED SENATOR OSITA NGWU, SENATE MINORITY WHIP ON HIS 4 MONTHS STEWARDSHIP AS CHAIRMAN, SENATE COMMITTEE ON SOLID MINERALS DEVELOPMENT OF THE 10TH SENATE

1. Introduction





Distinguished Senator Osita Ngwu representing Enugu West in the 10°Senate of the Federal Republic of Nigeria was appointed Chairman, Senate Committee on Solid Minerals Development of Monday, 7°August, 2023 by the Senate President, His Excellency Chief Dr. Godswill Obot Akpabio, the uncommon transformer and Chairman of the National Assembly. Leveraging on his knowledge and experience as a young and dynamic Engineer, who had put in over 15 years of active field operations in the extractive oil & gas industry in Nigeria, Senator Ngwu was in a very familiar terrain. So, he immediately hit the ground running, driven by patriotism, passion and commitment to add momentum to the policy thrust of the present Government of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, supported by uncommon transformation in the National Assembly to diversify the economy of Nigeria. He saw the Mining and Solid Minerals Sector as a low hanging fruit to advance a revolutionary transformation for Nigeria in multilateral economic development.

2. Working Strategies towards Harnessing Solid Mineral Potentials





The Chairman and his Committee devised and applied functional strategies to achieve efficiency in his primary goal to support the drive for economic diversification of Government through the Industry. The strategies include:

- ✓ Understanding the Industry
- ✓ Identifying Developmental Goals of the Sector
- ✓ Aligning policy thrust of the Federal Government with Developmental Goals

- ✓ Balancing projections, filling gaps through strategic positioning ✓ Legislative support
- ✓ International Support and Exchange Programmes
- ✓ Driving for sustained implementation and compliance

Effective application of these strategies led to the underlisted activities ultimately aimed at repositioning the sector for speedy transformation that would increase its contribution to the national GDP that was below 1% in 2023.

3. Legislative Intervention and Passage of Motions



Major Motions Moved and Passed on the Floor of the Senate

- i. Motion on Comprehensively Review of the input and output values of the Nigerian Mining Industry
- ii. Motion for Bureau of Public Enterprises (BPE) to return major mining Assets across Nigeria that the Bureau held dormant and non-performing for many years.

I. Motion on Comprehensively Review of the Input and Output Values of the Nigerian Mining Industry

On the 2nd of November, 2023, Distinguished Senator Ngwu sponsored and moved a Motion on Comprehensively Review of the input and output values of the Nigerian Mining Industry in the light of its potentials and central role to economic diversification, foreign exchange earnings and social inclusion for Nigeria.



The motion remains the major Motion moved and passage on the floor of the Senate towards reengineering of the Solid Minerals Sector. This is because the Motion tied previous and existing economic development policies in Nigeria to transformation of the Industry building in necessary oversight and compliance. The passage of the Motion gave impetus to Investigative Public Hearing by the Committee, which took place recently. This is pushing progress and activities in the sector faster.

I!. Motion for Bureau of Public Enterprises (BPE) to Return Major Mining Assets across Nigeria that the Bureau held Dormant and Non-performing

The Committee Chairman also moved a Motion for the BPE to return major mining assets in Enugu State and across Nigeria that the Bureau held dormant and non- performing for many years to the original owners of the titles. The passage of this Motion led to the reversal of these assets from the BPE to public sector owners and this has stimulated progress and development, as most of the titles have become active again.



4. Committee Meetings





The Senate Committee on Solid Minerals Development under Senator Osita Ngwu functioned effectively by holding timely meetings to address issues, evaluate progress and strategize the best ways to achieve identified goals. Members of the Committee including Senator Mustapha Khabeeb, Senator Benson Friday Konbowei, Senator Garba Musa Maidoki and others participated effectively to draw comprehensive work plan for the Committee to achieve set goals. The thrusts of the Committee were to achieve the following in the immediate:

- Employment generation through the development of the solid minerals sector;
- ii. Engaging the Bureau of Public Enterprises (BPE);
- iii. Seeking assistance from the Chinese Embassy to tackle illegal exploration;
- iv. Expanding revenue from the sector to the federation account;
- v. Establishing domestic refining of extracted minerals;
- vi. Improvement of laboratory facilities for better assessment;
- vii. Negotiating with State Governments and traditional leaders for effective resource management;
- viii. Simplifying laboratory procedures and streamlining the sample testing process.

The theme of the 2023 Mining Week is 'Capitalizing on Nigeria's Critical Minerals Resources for its Economic Growth. While addressing the theme: Senator Osita Ngwu stated that "it is time for the sector to do the work instead of doing the talk! He expressed displeasure at the mining week submit over the NEITI report that shows

that the sector was not living up to expectations; and so, he called for all hands to be on deck to reengineer the Industry for rapid growth.

6. Participation at NEITI Unveiling of NEITI 2023 Report





Senator Osita Ngwu, during the event, underscored the importance of choice, strategy and diplomacy in the quest to attract foreign investment to the country's solid minerals sector. At the Unveiling of the 2023 Report of the Nigeria Extractive Industry Transparency Initiative (NEITI) that took place in Abuja on Thursday, 7th September, 2023, the Committee Chairman expressed hope that Nigeria would have a lot of foreign investments in the Solid Mineral Sector going by current efforts of the Federal Government. He also called on the Federal Government to put in place strategies that will ensure that only responsible foreign investors operate in the sector.

While calling on government to evolve, strategies that will guard against the influx of irresponsible and lawless foreign investors, Ngwu expressed concern that some foreign investors are defrauding the country of its mineral wealth, as they evade payment of revenues due to Government.

7. Foreign Technical Support and Relations

a. Strengthening Nigeria - Egypt Partnership







The Chairman, Senate Committee on Solid Mineral Development, Senator Osita Ngwu paid a strategic courtesy visit to His Excellency Ihab Awab, the Ambassador of Egypt to Nigeria. The Senator was hosted at the Egypt Embassy on October 11, 2023 in a significant diplomatic engagement aimed at advancing the policy thrust of Government in the Sector. The primary purpose of the visit was to foster mutual understanding and explore potential areas of collaboration between the two nations, said Senator Ngwu while delivering his opening remarks that underscored the significance of bilateral cooperation. He emphasized the numerous benefits that could arise from partnership, especially within the solid mineral sector.

Senator Osita Ngwu provided a detailed overview of Nigeria's vast solid mineral resources, drawing attention to the untapped potential that lies within the nation's reserves. He stressed the necessity of strategic alliances to fully harness these resources, particularly in the domains of mining, processing and value addition. The discourse during the visit led to the exploration of several potential areas of collaboration. A focal point of discussion was the prospect of technology transfer, with Egypt expressing its willingness to share advanced mining technologies and techniques with Nigeria. This collaborative effort promises to enhance efficiency, safety, and sustainability within Nigeria's solid mineral sector. Senator Osita Ngwu significantly promoted investment potential inherent in Nigeria's solid mineral industry.

In his response, His Excellency Ihab Awab conveyed Egypt's keen interest in exploring investment opportunities in conjunction with Nigerian businesses and government agencies. The official meeting of Senator Osita Ngwu and His Excellency Ihab Awab laid a solid foundation for future collaboration between Nigeria and Egypt in the realm of solid minerals. The meeting served as a platform for the exchange of innovative ideas, expertise, and resources, potentially fueling economic growth, job creation, and sustainable development in both nations. The possibilities arising from this diplomatic engagement are poised to have far-reaching impacts, echoing the commitment of both countries for mutually beneficial cooperation.

As both nations eagerly anticipate the developments that will stem from this meeting, it becomes clear that this diplomatic rendezvous has set the stage for a promising partnership between Nigeria and Egypt in the dynamic landscape of solid mineral exploration and utilization. Follow up engagements to the visit culminated in the Ambassador introducing the multinational Mining Company in Egypt, La mancha Group that indicated interest in Nigeria mining sector and pledged to invest 500m USD into the sector.

b. Government and Private Sector of Turkeyi. Courtesy Visit to Ambassador of Republic of Turkey





n furtherance to his series of engagements towards ensuring a strong and prosperous Mining and Solid Minerals Industry for Nigeria, Distinguished Senator Osita Ngwu turned to the Republic of Turkey having understudied its Mining Sector and the progress the country is making in the Industry. The visit took place on 18th October 2023, when the Turkish Ambassador to Nigeria, H.E Hidayet Bayraktar hosted him. Discussion during the meeting centred on how to foster the business relation between Turkey and Nigeria. The Turkish Ambassador said that the business relationship between Turkey and Nigeria has not been tied with bilateral document as Nigeria has not signed their part of the agreements.

The Senate Committee Chairman observed that advancement in Mining has put Turkey on the world map as a recent publication by the United States Geological Survey (USGS), showed that, of the 90 ore types listed

in the Mineral Commodity Summaries, 70 are present in Turkey, and 60 of those are currently mined and traded internationally. He saw this experience as what Nigeria can tap into and leverage on to develop its Mining and Solid Minerals Sector. He wants Turkey to share these experiences and knowledge with Nigeria. He noted that the Nigerian – Turkish relationship has been smooth and cordial over the years and expressed concern that Turkish investors were not showing much interest in Nigeria's Mining Sector. He acknowledged that Turkish equipment are graded as one of the most efficient in the global Mining Industry and stressed the need for a better business collaboration between the two countries, as the Government of H.E Bola Ahmed Tinubu, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Federal Republic of Nigeria is very keen to move the Mining Sector to greater heights.

The Senator noted that the present Administration is seeking to develop the Mining and Agricultural Sectors to replace oil as main source of revenue for the country. He also stated that the 10th National Assembly is ready to Enact Business Friendly Laws that will aid Foreign Investors to have hitch-free business activities and seamless operations in Nigeria; and also feel safe and protected by Law while doing genuine businesses.

In his response, the Ambassador thanked the Senate Committee Chairman for his visit and assured him that he would relay his message back to the Turkish Government. He stated that he was aware of a Bill that ought to be passed in the Senate that would have facilitated smooth business dealings between Nigeria and Turkish nationals. He said that the Turkish Ministry of Trade met its own part of the agreement on the matter, but Nigeria did not respond as agreed. He disclosed that it was over a decade since that failed arrangement was experienced; as he disclosed that it was during the administration of President Olusegun Obasanjo that the agreement was to be signed.




Senator Ngwu also had a productive meeting with Melham FARAH, the West African Director, BD Alliance Enterprises Turkey and his team. The company is an Agro and Mining Conglomerate from Turkey with interest in Nigeria Mining and Agric sector, who visited the Senator to express their interest.

c. Government and Private Sector of China i. Visit to the Ambassador of Peoples Republic of China







This crucial visit, which took place on Monday, 9thOctober 2023 was also aimed at encouraging more Chinese investment in Nigeria's Solid Minerals Sector. Senator Ngwu Urged Investors to take advantage of Nigeria's favourable regulations to advance their genuine business in the Sector. The Senate Committee Chairman, who made the call during a visit to the Chinese Ambassador to Nigeria, Mr. Cui Jian Chun in Abuja, described Nigeria as an investment destination with several opportunities in the solid minerals sector. He affirmed that the opportunities highlight the potential for collaboration and economic growth between Nigeria and China.

Discussing specific investment opportunities that both countries can leverage upon, Senator Ngwu encouraged investors to invest in Mining Exploration and Development, saying that China has since been a major player in investing in the exploration and development of Nigeria's solid mineral resources. The Enugu West Senator stated that investments were necessary along the various value chain of the industry, stating that it could be in the area of mineral exploration, discovery and identifying of new mineral deposits, conducting feasibility studies, and implementing mining operations using advanced technologies.

The Senate Committee Chairman averred that it is an established fact that Nigeria has significant mineral reserves, and there is room for investment in mineral processing and value addition, suggesting that Nigerians or Chinese investors can explore this area for wealth creation. He noted that Nigerians can leverage on China's expertise in this area while partners can engage in joint ventures to establish processing plants that will add value to raw materials, thereby increasing their market value and creating more job opportunities. While saying that availability of infrastructure plays crucial role in the development of mining projects, Senator Ngwu said investments in infrastructure were crucial as they are needed to support the growth of the solid mineral industry.

He called on the Chinese business community to take advantage of investment opportunities in mining infrastructure by investing in the construction and maintenance of transport networks, such as roads, railways, and ports, to facilitate the efficient transportation of minerals from mining sites to processing facilities or export markets. Senator Ngwu also harped on the imperative of investing in technology and innovation, saying partnerships between China and Nigeria would do much to promote technology transfer and discovery in the country's mining sector.

He stated that China's advanced mining technologies and innovative practices can greatly benefit Nigeria's solid mineral sector, affirming that investments could be made to facilitate the transfer of technology, equipment, and technical know-how to enhance mining operations, improve efficiency, and ensure sustainable practices. Senator further stressed that Capacity Building and Skills Development is a vital aspect of professional

development in mining, stating that investments in training and capacity building initiatives are crucial to develop a skilled workforce in the solid mineral sector.

He urged Chinese companies to collaborate with Nigerian institutions to establish training programmes, workshops, and exchange programmes that focus on improving mining techniques, safety standards and environmental sustainability. The Senate Solid Minerals Committee Chairman said by capitalizing on these investment opportunities, Nigeria and China can foster meaningful partnerships that will not only contribute to the growth of the solid mineral sector, but also promote economic development and job creation in both countries. He also stressed the need for the minerals to be processed locally, which was agreed by the ambassador and called for initiation of policies that would benefit both countries and drive growth in the mining sector.

Senator Ngwu assured the Ambassador of the willingness of Nigeria's 10th National Assembly to provide the necessary legislative interventions to further create conducive investment environment for the transformation of the solid minerals sector. According to him, there were plans in the offing to work hand in hand with the various security agencies in Nigeria to create a safe environment for investors in the sector. Senator Ngwu urged the Chinese delegation to reject any offers from natives inviting them to engage in illegal mining without proper licensing. He noted that government was making efforts to increase the Competitive Growth and Poverty Reduction Program (CGPP) from what it is now to a higher percentage.


In his response, Ambassador Jianchun expressed the commitment of China to working together with Nigeria to achieve a sustainable and prosperous economy especially in the solid minerals sector. He also assured Senator Ngwu of China's commitment to support Nigeria in the mining sector, highlighting Chinese efforts to ensure that its immigrants coming to Nigeria for mining have properly registered licenses. Ambassador Jianchun further emphasized the need for a synergetic effect between both countries to drive change with a focus on creating more sustainable economy.

He expressed concerns over security and urged the Senate Committee Chairman to champion security policies to protect not just the investors but also the citizens of the nation. Jianchun noted the illegal mining, licensing, contracts, and internal disputes among Chinese companies, stressing their efforts to resolve these issues and promote legal mining. He disclosed the formation of the Mining Chinese Federation, where Chinese miners would register and collaborate to promote the mining industry in Nigeria. Ambassador Jianchun stated that China offered to support Nigeria with advanced technology to enhance mining in the country. Through the visit capacity building exchange programmes was commenced, whereby some Nigerians have undergone technical mining training in China.

The Meeting with the Ambassador of Australia to Nigeria, Ms Leann Johnston took place on 16th October, 2023 at the Australian High Commission in Abuja. During the visit, Senator Ngwu noted that Australia shares distinct

peculiarity with Nigeria when it comes to endowment with natural resources in the Solid Minerals Sector of the economy; but current data show that Australia has advanced considerably in exploration and exploitation of its Solid Mineral Resources for national development. It is as a result, he said that mutually beneficial bilateral relations with Australia in the Solid Minerals Sector is important to further develop the Sector. The Distinguished Senate Committee Chairman expressed interest in tapping into the trends, schemes and developments that resulted in the mining boom for Australia so as to replicate same for development of Nigeria's Solid Minerals Sector.

The Distinguished Senator acknowledged the contributions of the Australian Government to the Nigerian Mining Sector. He stated that Australia has been a renowned global player in Mining for centuries and has gathered experiences that Nigeria as a nation would need to advance her potentials in the Mining and Solid Minerals Development Sector of the economy. He affirmed that Nigeria needs the economic boost that the Mining Sector can stimulate for increased contribution of the Sector to the GDP, as is evident in Australia. The Distinguished Senator averred that a strong bilateral relation between Nigeria and Australia will drive a transfer of technology that will support Nigeria to begin to attract and own strong, modern Mining Equipment, Technology and Services (METS) like it is in Australia.

He stated that Nigeria has huge solid minerals deposits and needs leading developments in innovation and automated mining technology to service the industry, which he said, a bilateral relation with Australia will offer. He noted that the collaboration between the two countries in the Mining and Solid Mineral Development Sector will be of mutual economic benefits, as it will be an opportunity for Australian companies to penetrate Nigeria, the most populous black nation in the world and access its huge market. While expressing pleasure over a recent offer by the Australian Government to train Nigerians in the Mining Industry, the Distinguished Senator reminded the Ambassador of this exchange programme aimed at transfer of knowledge and technology to Nigerians, who would be selected by The Nigerian Government to represent the country in the programme in Australia.

Speaking further, the Senator stated that the commitment was made when Nigeria's Ministerial officials visited Australia for 'The Australia Down Under,' a Mining Submit organized annually by the Australian

Government and attended by almost all the mining countries of the world, of which Nigeria is a key participant. Stating the need to advance further in Exchange Programmes between the two countries, the Senator stated that capacity building and manpower development for Nigerians will ultimately be gainful for Australian companies that will operate in Nigeria. He closed his remarks by assuring the Ambassador that the $10^{\rm th}$ National Assembly will do all within its powers to enact Laws that will be business friendly by creating enabling environment and also by accommodating foreigners who are willing to invest in the Nigeria's Mining Sector.

He assured the Ambassador that the 10th Assembly is committed to ensuring that foreign investments are protected provided the investors comply with due diligence and avoid engaging in illegal mining activities. In his response, the Ambassador acknowledged the relationship between the two nations, stating that Australia is very willing to support Nigeria's Mining Sector for transformational growth and development. She disclosed that there are programmes that the Australian Government is willing to extend to Nigeria to help in transfer of technology and knowledge and reiterated Australian Government's willingness to commence the training of Nigerians in recent technologies in the Mining Industry, as offered in the last 'Australian Down Under' programme in Perth, Australia

Senator Ngwu assured the **Ambassador of the** willingness of Nigeria's 10th **National Assembly to** provide the necessary legislative interventions to further create connducive aivestment environment for the transformation of the solid minerals sector.

The Chargé d'Affaires, discussed on how Australia can help educate/train Nigerian miners and a programme was agreed to be established for the purpose of training Nigerian miners in Australia.

He also disclosed that it was the agency that announced the quality of Nigeria's Lithium through the National Integrated Minerals Explorational Project (NIMEP) in which the Federal Government spent N14.5B to achieve a credible mineral data report for Nigeria and that is what the international committee are working with.

c. Meeting with the DG of NMCO







On September 28, 2023, the Director General of the Nigeria Mining Cadastre Office (NMCO) had a meeting with the Chairman, which centred on the essence and operations of the Agency towards driving revenue generation in the Sector. He also spoke about the new eMC+ that was introduced by his administration as NMCO Director General. He noted that the electronic platform has eased the issue of double applications, over lapping in mineral title applications and other conflicts in processing mineral titles in Nigeria. Though it has its own little obstruction of delay in application grants, it ensures that applications are processed without issues that will later lead the agency to court with applicants, said the Director General.

The Senate Committee under the chairmanship of Distinguished Senator Osita Ngwu was very clear with its vision and direction. The Committee was very active and patriotically committed to creating wealth for Nigeria through our country's vast Solid Mineral resources spatially distributed across the country. REQUEST FOR SPEEDY COMPLETION OF IVO RIVER DAM PROJECT IN ENUGU STATE

I write to bring to your attention, the deplorable and abandoned state of the Ivo River Dam Project in Enugu State and the urgent need for budgetary intervention to facilitate its speedy completion, given its critical nature.

The Project, which was awarded by the Federal Government in 2012, was conceived as a multi-purpose Dam, built for irrigation, water supply, fishery, electricity generation and to enable the host communities to engage in intensive agriculture, food processing and agro-allied businesses.

I have engaged the Honourable Minister of Water Resources with a view to accommodating the project in the 2024 Appropriation and I am optimistic of some fund allocations. I however appeal that you use your good offices to ensure that significant funding is approved for the project.

Please find attached my letter to the Hon. Minister of Water Resource for your perusal.



It is therefore safe to say that the Ivo River Dam Project is 75% complete but abandoned at this critical stage, and the huge N5.2 billion already spent on the project will be totally wasted if it is not speedily completed.

I wish to bring to the attention of the Honourable Minister that the man-made but avoidable human disaster that the non-completion of the Ivo River dam project by the Federal Ministry of Water Resources has caused my constituents can only be imagined and described.

Without the spillway being in place, the farmlands and rural settlements in the upstream communities have been inundated and sacked by floods, which prior to the construction of the dam had never experienced.

Since the abandonment of the project, over 40,000 acres of arable farmland and rural settlement communities have remained permanently flooded till date as a result of the dam embankment, and during the rainy seasons, the flood gets higher and spreads more to inland communities, thereby sacking the rural dwellers and inundating farmlands, rendering over 10,000 households homeless on a yearly basis.

The flood has become a life-threatening menace and death-recurring trap for the hapless farmers, especially during the rainy seasons at Okpanku and Mpu communities in Aninri LGA of Enugu West District. As a result of the failed dam project, the masses are now victims of circumstantial fraternity with unclean water and the destruction of their livelihoods.

I sincerely request and invite the consideration of the Honourable Minister to take urgent steps to ameliorate this deplorable situation by approving the speedy completion of the Ivo River Dam Project to save the huge public fund already sunk in the project and for the interest of humanity. I have attached the Project picture for more clarity.

The initiative arose following my sponsorship of JAMB forms for over 200 students in 2022, which resulted in over a 70% failure rate. I envisioned an academy that would represent a significant step toward revitalizing education in our zone with a pilot starting in Ngwo. It is distinguished by its inclusive approach, offering seven-month free JAMB preparatory lessons and Computer based tests to both indigenous and nonindigenous students.

The Objective:

- 1. To foster an interest in education among the youth.
- 2. To enable students to achieve high scores in JAMB exams.
- 3. To facilitate effective communication and mentorship between teachers and students.
- 4. To nurture entrepreneurship skills and personal development in students.

Achievements so far:

- 1. Over 200 students received sponsorship for JAMB preparatory lessons and the 2024 JAMB examination.
- 2. The pilot project achieved a 70% success rate.
- 3. I have awarded over 80 million naira in scholarships to various student categories, from top scorers to the most needy students of the academy, for the complete duration of their university studies.
- 4. Academically, the initiative serves as a catalyst for societal change, empowering young minds and emphasizing the importance of education.
- 5. It has fostered unity among students, reducing idleness and combating social vices such as cultism.



e established the Enugu West Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Desk to provide efficient and effective dispute resolution mechanisms for the people of Enugu West. This initiative is aimed at promoting access to timely mediation, equitable justice and peaceful conflict resolution.

- ✓ Ejinaka Emelda's Father: Convicted with a fine; no family support for appeal.
- ✓ Ozoani Midweek Ugochukwu: Detained by DSS; petition to be sent.
- ✓ Emmanuel Okechukwu: Charged with murder; committee to observe proceedings.
- ✓ Ndidiamaka Okongwu: Arrested by NDLA; case rejected by the committee.
- ✓ Ani Samuel & Chidozie Offor: Convicted for armed robbery; recommended for governor's pardon.
- ✓ Dennis Ozongwu: Convicted of murder; recommended for amnesty.
- ✓ Ifedi Sunday: Detained by DSS; committee to limit activities to correctional centers.
- ✓ Izuchukwu Ezechukwu:Represented in court for armed robbery.
- ✓ Mr. Nwagbarani Michael Onyemachi: Taken by Nigerian Army; assigned to Barr Agu Princewill.
- ✓ Chukwudi Ozor: Prosecuted for stealing; exploring settlement options.
- ✓ COP vs. Chukwuezie (MOR/30c/2023):** Court is inclined to discharge but requires family involvement.











